Thought Question:

“Share” in **verse 6** is commonly considered as possessing a monetary sense in this passage. It is the Greek, *koinōneō*, found 8x in the New Testament (Rom. 12:13, “distributing”; 15:27, “partakers”; Gal. 6:6, “share”; Phil. 4:15, “shared”; 1 Tim. 5:22, “share”; Heb. 2:14, “partaken”; 1 Pet. 4:13, “partake”; 2 John 11, “shares”). Examine these passages. Does the word demand a monetary sense? Is there a use of “share” that fits the context better than that of financial support of gospel preachers? Explain.
