- A. Salutation (vv. 1-2)
 - a. Authorship: Paul and Timothy, bondservants of Jesus Christ.
 - b. Recipients: To the saints in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons.
 - c. Greetings: Grace and peace from God and Jesus.

 - a. His remembrance and thanksgiving (vv. 3-8):
 - i. Paul thanks God for them and makes requests with joy, especially for their fellowship in the gospel. (vv. 3-5)
 - ii.He has confidence God will complete His work in them. (v. 6)
 - 1. His confidence is appropriate because of their place in his heart, their share in his chains, and defense and confirmation of the gospel. (v. 7)
 - 2.He greatly longs for them with the affection of Jesus Christ. (v. 8)

 - a. His remembrance and thanksgiving (vv. 3-8):
 - b. His prayer for love abounding in knowledge and discernment (vv. 9-11):
 - i. That they may approve the excellent. (v. 10a)
 - ii. That they may be sincere and without offense. (v. 10b)
 - iii. That they would be fruitful in righteousness by Jesus Christ to God's glory. (v. 11)

- A. In Prison Christ is Preached (vv. 12-18)
 - a. What has happened to him has led to the furtherance of the gospel. (v. 12)
 - i. It is evident to all his chains are in Christ. (v. 13)
 - ii. Most brethren have become confident by his chains and speak the word boldly without fear. (v. 14)
 - b. Some preach Christ from envy and strife, and some from goodwill: (v. 15)
 - i. The former preach from selfish ambition, to add affliction to Paul. (v. 16)
 - ii. The latter preach out of love, knowing he is appointed for the defense of the gospel. (v. 17)
 - iii.He rejoices that Christ is preached regardless of the motives. (v. 18)

- A. In Prison Christ is Preached (vv. 12-18)
- B. Life or Death Christ is Magnified (vv. 19-26)
 - a. He knows this will turn out for his deliverance (v. 19a)
 - i. Through their prayer and the supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ. (v. 19b)
 - ii. According to his expectation and hope that he will not be ashamed, but that Christ will be magnified by life or death. (v. 20)

- A. In Prison Christ is Preached (vv. 12-18)
- B. Life or Death Christ is Magnified (vv. 19-26)
 - a. He knows this will turn out for his deliverance (v. 19a)
 - b. To live is Christ, and to die is gain. (v. 21)
 - i. To live means fruit from his labor; he does not know what to choose. (v. 22)
 - ii. He is hard-pressed between the two. (v. 23a)
 - 1.He desires to depart and be with Christ. (v. 23b)
 - 2.He knows to remain in the flesh is more needful for them. (v. 24)
 - c. He is confident that he will remain and help them, and they will rejoice at his coming. (vv. 25-26)

- III. An Exhortation to Stand Fast Together (vv. 27-30)
- A. Strive Together for the Faith of the Gospel (v. 27)
 - a. Let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ. (v. 27a)
 - b. So whether he sees them or is absent: (v. 27b)
 - i. They stand fast in one spirit, with one mind. (v. 27c)
 - ii. Striving together for the faith of the gospel. (v. 27d)
- B. Do Not Be Terrified by Adversaries (vv. 28-30)
 - a. Not terrified by your adversaries. (v. 28a)
 - i. A proof of perdition to them. (v. 28b)
 - ii. A proof of salvation from God to you. (v. 28c)
 - b. They have been granted to not only believe but suffer for Christ like Paul. (vv. 29-30)
