- I. Exhortations to Prayer and Proper Conduct Toward Outsiders (4:2-6)
- A. Continue in Prayer (vv. 2-4)
  - a. Be constant, earnest, vigilant, and thankful in prayer. (v. 2)
  - b. Praying also for us. (v. 3a)
    - i. Pray for an open door for the word to speak the mystery. (v. 3b)
    - ii. That I may make it manifest, as I ought to speak. (v. 4)
- B. Walk Wisely, and Redeem the Time (vv. 5-6)
  - a. Walk wisely toward unbelievers, redeeming the time. (v. 5)
  - b. Have graceful, seasoned speech to know how to answer unbelievers. (v. 6)

  - a. Tychicus is a beloved brother, faithful minister, and fellow servant. (v. 7a)
    - i. Paul is sending him to relay news about him. (vv. 7b-8a)
    - ii. That he may comfort your hearts with this news. (v. 8b)
  - b. One of them, Onesimus, a faithful and beloved brother, is coming too. (v. 9a)
  - c. They will make known what is happening with Paul. (v. 9b)

- B. Those Who Send Greetings (vv. 10-15)
  - a. Aristarchus, Mark the cousin of Barnabas, and Jesus who is called Justus greets them. (vv. 10-11a)
    - i. They are the only fellow workers of Paul who are Jews. (v. 11b)
    - ii. They have proved to be a comfort. (v. 11c)
  - b. Epaphras, one of them, greets them. (v. 12a)
    - i. He prays fervently for them to be perfect and complete in God's will. (v. 12b)
    - ii. Paul testifies to his zeal for them, the Laodiceans, and those in Hierapolis. (v. 13)
