The Disciple's Security

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name (John 1:12)

A Child Of God

- We have a right to be called a child of God
 John 1:12; Romans 8:16
- We have been born again
 - **№**1 Peter 1:23
- We have been adopted
 - Promans 8:15-17; Galatians 4:4-7, Ephesians 1:5

The Blessings Of Being A Child Of God

- 1. We have a new name (Acts 11:26)

- 6. We have an inheritance (Rom. 8:16-17)

The Responsibilities Of Being A Child Of God

- 1. We must keep ourselves separate from the sinful world (2 Cor. 6:17-18)
- 2. We must love God and keep His commandments (Matt. 22:36-38, 1 John 5:3)
- 3. We must trust in God to keep His promises (2 Cor. 5:7; 2 Tim. 1:12)
- 4. We must follow God's word, grow, and live holy lives (2 Pet. 3:18; 1 Cor. 10:13)

The Responsibilities Of Being A Child Of God

- → If we leave our Father's house, we forfeit all rights and privileges as a son (Luke 15:11-24), as well as our eternal soul (James 5:19-20)
- When we sin, we must repent and seek God's forgiveness (Acts 8:22; 1 John 1:9)

...whoever desires to become great among you, let him be your servant. And whoever desires to be first among you, let him be your slave (Matt. 20:26-27)

A Unique Role For A Servant

- Disciples are servants of Christ
- However, not only are we to serve our Master (Christ), we must also serve one another (our fellow servants)
- Matthew 20:20-28

LESSON 10: STANGERS AND PILGRIMS

The Disciple's Walk of Faith

These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off were assured of them, embraced them and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth (Hebrews 11:13)

What Are Strangers And Pilgrims?

- Stranger translated from the Greek word xenos which literally means "a foreigner"
- Thus, a stranger is one who is out of his own country, someone who is in a foreign land
- Pilgrim translated from the Greek word parepidemos, which refers to a resident foreigner, one who lives among a people who are not his own
- This person does not have the rights of a citizen, nor is he seeking a permanent residence

What Makes Us Strangers And Pilgrims?

- 1. Disciples are called out of this world and made citizens of a heavenly kingdom (Col. 1:13; Phil. 3:20)
- 2. Disciples are following one whom the world has rejected (John 15:18-21)
- 3. Disciples no longer think like the people of the world (Rom. 12:2)

What Does It Take To Live Like Strangers And Pilgrims?

- 1. Trust in God's promises (Rom. 4:20-21)
- 2. Obedience to God's instructions (Heb. 11:8)
- 3. Coming out from the world (1 Pet. 1:15-17; 2 Cor. 6:14-18)
- 4. Delaying gratification (Heb. 12:15-17)
- 5. Commitment (Heb. 10:34-36; Rev. 2:10)

LESSON 11: SALT AND LIGHT

The Disciple's Influence

You are the salt of the earth ... You are the light of the world (Matt. 5:13-14)

The Disciple's Influence

- Matthew 5:13-16
- Disciples are to have a positive influence upon the world
- We are the salt of the earth and the light of the world

Salt

- 1. Salt preserves
- 2. Salt gives flavor
- 3. Salt creates thirst

Light

- 1. Light reveals and illuminates
- 2. Light drives away darkness
- 3. Light gives guidance
- 4. Light warms and comforts
- 5. Light draws those who want to come out of the darkness

Maintaining Our Influence

- Jesus spoke of salt losing its flavor (Matt. 5:13)
- We must "practice what we preach" (Rom. 2:17-24; 2 Cor. 8:21)
- We cannot compromise with sin and error (Gal. 2:4-5)
- We must show our loyalty to Christ over the world (2 Tim. 2:19; James 4:4)

LESSON 12: AN APOLOGIST

The Disciple's Answer

But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear (1 Peter 3:15)

An Apologist

- ● We are to be ready to give a "defense" (1 Pet. 3:15)
- The word "defense" is translated from the Greek word *apologian*, from which we get our English word "apology"
- This Greek word, however, does not convey the idea that Christians are to apologize for their faith
- It means to give a verbal defense, or a speech in one's defense, as in court
- This Greek term is also found in our English word "apologetics," which is a branch of theology devoted to defending the evidence that supports Christianity

An Apologist - 1 Peter 3:15

- 1. Sanctify the Lord God in your hearts
 - We are to give Christ the position of Lord and Master in our hearts
 - We must believe that His teaching is worth believing, obeying, and defending

An Apologist - 1 Peter 3:15

2. Always be ready

- Readiness requires preparation
- ■ We are to study the Word of God (2 Tim. 2:15)
- Prepare for and attend Bible classes
- Attend worship services, Gospel Meetings, etc.

An Apologist - 1 Peter 3:15

- 3. To give a defense
 - From the word of God
 - Psalm 119:160

An Apologist - 1 Peter 3:15

- 4. To everyone who asks you
 - We should welcome and appreciate opportunities to defend the gospel and help others come to a knowledge of the truth
 - However, there are some questions and people who are not deserving of our attention
 - №1 Timothy 6:3-5; 2 Timothy 2:16-18; Titus 3:10-11; Matthew 7:6

An Apologist - 1 Peter 3:15

- 5. A reason for the hope that is in you
 - The existence of God
 - The resurrection and deity of Christ
 - The inspiration of the Bible
 - Why we believe in Heaven and Hell
 - What one must do in order to be saved
 - The purpose and method of baptism
 - Why we reject denominationalism
 - Why we do not use instrumental music
 - Why we partake of the Lord's Supper every Sunday

An Apologist - 1 Peter 3:15

- 6. With the proper attitude
 - Meekness (Eph. 4:15; Col. 4:6)
 - ❤ Fear (Rom. 14:12)
 - → Maintaining a good conscience (1 Pet. 3:16)
