Controversies Regarding the Sabbath (6:1-12)

- Jesus is questioned by the Pharisees about His disciples plucking and eating grain on the Sabbath, and He responds (vv. 1-5).
- On another Sabbath, Jesus heals a man with a withered hand in the presence of the Pharisees, enraging them against Him (vv. 6-11).

Selection of the Twelve (6:13-17)

- Jesus went to a mountain to continue all night in prayer to God (v. 12).
- The following day, Jesus chooses twelve from His disciples and names them apostles (vv. 13-16).

- Jesus came down to a level place on the mountain to a multitude ready to hear Him and be healed by Him. Jesus heals them all (vv. 17-19).
- The Beatitudes (vv. 20-26)
 - Jesus speaks of the characteristics of those blessed in the kingdom of God (vv. 20-23).
 - Jesus pronounces woes upon those who possess opposite characteristics (vv. 24-26).

- Love Your Enemies (vv. 27-36)
 - Jesus speaks about proper love for even enemies, and thus negates vengeance (vv. 27-31).
 - Jesus calls disciples to love even as the Father loves (vv. 32-36).

- The Beatitudes (vv. 20-26)
- Love Your Enemies (vv. 27-36)
- Judging (vv. 37-45)
 - Jesus explains that the same measure we use in judgment of others will be returned to us (vv. 37-38).
 - Jesus explains that judgment must not lack clarity through poor teaching, and hypocrisy (vv. 39-42).
 - Jesus explains the distinction between a good man and an evil man (vv. 43-45).

- Love Your Enemies (vv. 27-36)
- Judging (vv. 37-45)
- Building on a Solid Foundation (vv. 46-49)
 - Jesus indicates inconsistency in calling Him Lord without corresponding obedience (v. 46).
 - Jesus uses imagery of builders to encourage His disciples to show wisdom by putting the things they hear from Him into action (vv. 46-49).
